C8 Radiator Guards

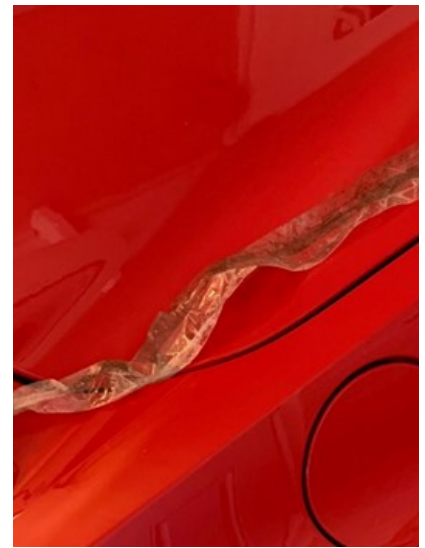
I installed the front radiator guards after about 1000 miles. I noticed many dents in the radiators, and wished I noticed the damage sooner. I installed the ones with cable ties, but a bolt-on set is available.

After some doves got into my engine compartment and pooped on my engine cover, I ordered guards for the engine compartment. I ordered the plastic grills that install without screws required. They make guards that bolt on as well. I think the plastic grills are OK, but I wonder if I should have installed the ones attached with hardware.

The other day as I walked back to my car, I noticed something sticking out from the driver side radiator intake. I pulled it out and took it home. It turned out to be about 3 feet of cellophane tape with no adhesive left on it.



Imagine as the engine temperature started increasing, how difficult it would be for you and your friends to figure out what was wrong with your Stingray. Maybe you might want to install some radiator guards. Ron
