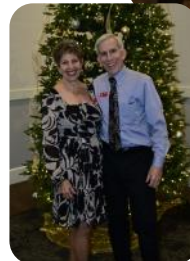
The all favorite gift exchange was the last item on the agenda. WOW what a blast! We hope everyone had a great time and thank you all for coming.
